CHAPTER 470.

AN ACT to further supplement an act, entitled
 "An act to incorporate companies to make several Turnpike Roads through Baltimore county,"
 and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the president, managers and company of the Baltimore and Yorktown Turnpike Road be and they are hereby authorized at any time to sell and convey, or mortgage or otherwise pledge, any lands or other property possessed by them; and also to issue their bonds, in such **Sell or mortgage.**
