

visor shall keep a list of all delinquents, and report the same to a justice of the peace of the election district in which he is supervisor.

SEC. 157. The justice to whom such list shall be reported shall issue his warrant in the name of the State for every person so appearing to be delinquent, to be directed to some constable of the district, directing him to bring said delinquent before him for trial, and if upon trial it shall appear that said delinquent failed to appear at the time and place appointed by the supervisor, his agent or deputy, with proper implements for work, unless prevented by sickness or wheat harvest, or appearing, refused or neglected to perform reasonable labor, and has not furnished a substitute or paid the supervisor, his agent or deputy, as aforesaid, the justice shall fine each delinquent the sum of seventy-five cents for each day's delinquency and cost, and shall order the person fined to stand committed until the fines and fees are paid, and in all such prosecutions the supervisor shall be a competent witness for the State; provided that in all cases in which fines may be imposed under this law, any person may appeal to the Circuit Court, as in other cases, giving bond with good security, in the penalty of twenty-five dollars, to prosecute his appeal with effect.

SEC. 158. All fines collected by any justice of the peace under the preceding sections shall be by him paid over to the road supervisor; and these fines, together with all the monies paid to road supervisors by persons in lieu of their work on the county roads, shall be spent by the supervisors in employing other laborers and hiring teams, or any other necessary expenses in repairing and improving roads; and the supervisor shall furnish a statement under oath to the County Commissioners of all monies collected and expended, and of each day's labor employed on the road, his own labor being separately itemized.

Fines—how disposed of.

SEC. 159. It shall be the duty of the supervisor to assign each individual a reasonable and uniform amount of work each day, and direct him how to perform it; the ditches on the side of the public roads shall be cut and opened so as to furnish the
