

“An act to repeal section forty-eight of an Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, entitled ‘An act to amend the charter of the city of Cumberland by repealing sections twenty-two, &c., passed at the January session of the General Assembly of Maryland, eighteen hundred and seventy-four, chapter one hundred;’” also to repeal section fifty-two of article one of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title “Allegany County,” sub-title “Cumberland,” and re-enact the same with amendments, be and is hereby repealed, and all other acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act are also hereby repealed. Inconsistent acts repealed

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage, but shall not in any manner effect existing ordinances of said city or any acts done thereunder. How operative.

CHAPTER 485.

AN ACT to prohibit the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors or lager beer in the town of Laurel, Prince George’s county, Maryland, and at any place in Prince George’s county, Maryland, within one mile of the present site of the office of the Commissioners of Laurel.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That hereafter it shall not be lawful for the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Prince George’s county, Maryland, to issue a license to any person or persons whatsoever to sell spirituous or fermented liquors of any kind or lager beer at any place within the town of Laurel, Prince George’s county, Maryland, or at any place in said county within one mile of the office of the commissioners of said town of Laurel, as now located. Sale of spirituous liquors prohibited.
