George Brent to "Brent's Landing," on Port Tobacco Creek, in Charles county, from the point of its Road exceptintersection with the public road to Cedar Point Neck, be and the same is hereby excepted from the provisions of the act of eighteen hundred and seventysix, chapter two hundred and ninety-one.

CHAPTER 70.

AN ACT to define and preserve the Inner Harbor of Cambridge and Cambridge Creek in Dorchester, county.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That in order to preserve the navigation of Cambridge creek, in Dorchester county, and secure from encroachment a commodious harbor at the town of Cambridge, Thomas H. Handy, William J. Thomas and James L. Bryan be and they Commissionare hereby appointed commissioners to survey the eis to survey. said creek, from its mouth up to the several heads of its respective branches, or as far as they may think necessary, and define and establish lines on both sides of said creek and its branches, to which wharves, lines buildings and other improvements from either shore may be made and erected.
