Salary of Sec. 9. The warden shall receive a salary at the rate of two thousand dollars per year, and shall be allowed subsistance, fuel, and the occupancy of such parts of the front buildings as a dwelling as are not used for purposes of the penitentiary, and all necessary out-houses, yards and grounds not within the No other perwalls of the prison proper, but shall receive no other quisites. pay, emoluments or perquisites for his services.

CHAPTER 75.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to pay N. C. Robertson, Clerk of the Baltimore City Court, the costs and expenses in certain cases in which the State of Maryland was the plaintiff, and judgments rendered in favor of the defendants.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Comptroller of the Treasury be and he is hereby authorized and directed to directed to isissue his warrant upon the Treasurer, to pay N. C. sue warrant. Robertson, Clerk of the Baltimore City Court, three hundred and eighty-two dollars and fifteen cents, the costs and expenses due him as clerk in certain cases pending in the Baltimore City Court, in which the State of Maryland was the plaintiff, and judgments rendered therein in favor of the defendant.

SEC 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take In force effect from and after the date of its passage.
