## REPORT:

The report of the Joint Conference Committee on the amendments to House Bill No. 36, entitled "an Act to repeal section 367," of Article 4, of the Public Local Laws, title "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Harbor, Docks and Wharves," and to re enact the same with amendments, respectfully recommend:

1st. That the Senate recede from the amendments striking out all after the word "city," in line 7, section 1, and striking out in line 8, of section 1, the following words, "the public wharves in said city."

2nd. And to adopt, as an amendment to said bill, after the words "public wharves," in line 8, section 1, the following, "other than wharves belonging to or rented by the State, and that part of Pratt street wharf reserved for the use of the State."
