The Senate having refused to concur in certain amendments proposed by the House to Senate Bill No. 307, entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments sections 26 and 27, of Article 63, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Militia," sub-title "Maryland National Guard."

We respectfully request your Honorable Body to recede from said amendment.
