BY THE SENATE.

April 2d, 1892.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

As the present session of the General Assembly will terminate by Constitutional limitation on Monday April 4th, midnight, we propose that a Joint Committee, to be composed of two members of the Senate and three of the House of Delegates, be appointed to wait upon the Governor for the purpose of communicating this fact, and ascertaining whether he has any further communication to make.
