Ordered, That five days and mileage be allowed to Wm. H. Ady. Sergeant-at-Arms, and to William F. Sudler, Door-keeper, for services rendered the Senate at the present session, and the Chairman of the Committee on Claims is hereby directed to credit and pay such claims upon taking the proper vouchers thereof.
