Your message in lieu of the message of the Senate of the 27th inst., relating to the fixing of the sessions of the General Assembly, for the remainder of the session, by joint action, which proposes that the two Houses shall, during the remainder of this session, and until otherwise ordered by the joint action of the two Houses, hold sittings on every day, except Saturdays and Sundays. That when the Houses adjourn on Friday, they shall stand adjourned until the succeeding Monday, at 8 o'clock, P. M., and that the hour of convening on other days shall be such as the respective Houses may designate.

Provided, That it shall be in the province of either House to sit on Saturday, if the condition of its business shall require it, and to hold as many sittings per day as it may deem necessary and proper, is received, and we concur therein.
