INTRODUCTION OF BILLS.

By Mr. Hubner, the following bills :

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 188 to 217, inclusive of Article 3, of the Code of Public Local, Laws, title "Baltimore County," sub-title "Roads," and to enact new sections in lieu thereof.

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Hubner, Rogers and Robinson.

Senate bill entitled Act to grant the sanction and consent of the General Assembly of Maryland to the sale by William J. Hiss, and other trustees, of a lot of ground in Baltimore city, and the annual rent issuing thereout to Saint Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church at Baltimore city.
