Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments section 653 B, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Liquor and Intoxicating Drinks," as enacted by chapter 343 of the Acts of 1890.

With the following proposed amendment:

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

In section 1, in 9th line, after the word "prescribed," insert the following words, viz:

"Provided, however, that the Liquor License Commissioners appointed in April, 1890, shall continue in office until the expiration of the term for which they were appointed."
