the support of two insane convicts at the Sylvan Retreat Asylum, for the years 1890 and 1891.

Which were read the first time and referred to the

Committee on Finance.

House bill entitled an Act to repeal section 2, of

chapter 95, of the Acts of 1858,

Which was read the second time.

Senate bill entitled an Act to extend and enlarge the privileges and powers of the Baltimore and Cumberland Railway Company, incorporated under and by the general laws of this State.

Which was read the second time, and ordered to be

engrossed for a third reading.

ported favorably the following:

Ordered, That the Finance Committee of the Senate be and is hereby authorized to audit and settle the expenses incurred in procuring the necessary furniture and supplies for the use of said committee, and also the expense incurred in coloring the walls and ceilings of the rooms of said committee, which said work was done to remove the discolorations and stains from dampness on said walls and ceilings.
