PETITIONS, MEMORIALS, &c.

Mr. Seibert, presented the memorial of Joseph A. Shrader, Augustus Sprankle and 84 other citizens of Washington county, praying the passage of an Act to amend the local laws in reference to fences, so as to apply to District No. 23.

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Seibert, Newman and Robinson.

Also,

The memorial of John T. Snyder and 41 other citizens of the town of Clearspring, Washington county, praying the repeal of sections 72 and 78, of Article 22, of the Code of Public Local Laws.

Also the memorial of P. J. Prather, John T. Peterman and 38 other citizens of the town of Clearspring, Washington county, praying the Legislature not to grant a charter for a corporation in said town.

Which were read, and referred to the Committee on Corporations.

Mr. Waters presented the memorial of Joseph S. Webster and 115 other citizens of Somerset county, against the shortening of the time for catching oysters.
