House bill entitled an Act to add an additional section to Article 10, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Dorchester County," to be called "Section 321," regulating the pay of witnesses.

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Austin, Waters and Smith.

House bill entitled an Act to regulate the county printing and publishing in Baltimore county, and to provide for having the same done by contract.

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Hubner, Moss and Bennett.

House bill entitled an Act to repeal chapter 268, Acts of 1876, to authorize Geo. L. Michaels to erect two gates on the public road leading through the farm of the said Geo. L. Michaels.

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Getty, Waters and Austin.

House bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 305, 306, 307, 308 and 309, of Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws of the State of Maryland, title "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Fines and Forfeitures," and re enact section 305 with amendments.
