Mr. Wirt presented the memorial of Joseph Tome and 39 other citizens of Cecil county, praying the Legislature to grant equitable relief to the sureties of Stevenson Archer.

Which was read, and referred to the Committee on Finance.

Mr. Waters presented the memorial of 77 citizens and taxpayers in Crisfield district of Somerset county, protesting against the extension of the corporate limits of the town of Crisfield, in said county.

Ordered by the Senate, That the Public Printer print and have bound in cloth, as a memorial volume, for the use of the General Assembly, 200 copies of the addresses, orders, messages and resolutions passed by the Senate, relating to the death of the late Senator, Joseph Frank Talbott.
