House bill entitled an Act to repeal section 52, of Article 77, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Crimes and Punishments," sub-title "Destroying Property Maliciously," and to re enact the same with amendments,

House bill entitled an Act to repeal section 2, of Article 36, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Fees of Officers," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

House bill entitled an Act to cede to the United States jurisdiction over certain lands at or near the Antietam battle field.

House bill entitled an Act to sanction the devise by Sarah Ann Taylor, late of Charles county, of certain real estate, to the Vestry of Durham Parish of the Protestant Episcopal Church of said county.
