With the following proposed amendment:

Strike out the word "section" before the figure "657." in fifth line of section 1.

Also, insert the words "seven dollars" before the mark "\$," in sixth line of section 1.

Which was adopted.

Said bill, as amended, was read the second time.

And unfaverably,

House bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 305, 306, 307, 308 and 309, of Article 4, of the Public Local Laws of the State of Maryland, title "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Fines and Forfeitures," and reenact section 305 with amendments.

Which was adopted.
