wife, of the District of Columbia, parties of the first part and the United States of America, party of the

second part.

That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of twelve thousand one hundred. and nine 7-100 dollars lawful money of the United States to them in hand paid by the party of the second part, the receipt of which before the sealing and delivery of these presents is hereby acknowledged, have given, granted, bargained, and sold, aliened, enfeoffed, released, conveyed and confirmed and do by these presents, give, grant, bargain and sell, alien, enfeoff, release, convey and confirm unto the party of the second part the following described land and premises situate, lying and being partly in Prince George's county, in the State of Maryland, and partly in the District of Columbia, as shown on a plat of the survey of certain tracts of land called "Oxon Hill," "Oxon Hill Manor," "Bean's Bargain," "Pleasant Hills," "Barnaba Manor" and "Talbott's Lot," made by Wm. J. Latimer, and filed in equity cause No. 1208, in the Circuit Court for Prince George's county aforesaid. the said pieces or parcels of land hereby conveyed being described as follows:
