House bill entitled an Act for the relief of the sureties upon the official bonds of Stevenson Archer, late Treasurer of Maryland, and for the settlement of the litigation on said bonds.

House bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 2, 5, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 20, 20 A, 21, 28, 33 and 34, of Article 72, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Oysters."

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on the Chesapeake Bay and its Tributaries.
