At the last meeting of this District Assembly, it directed its Legislative Committee to forward you the following resolutions, and respectfully request you to submit the same to your Honorable Body:

Resolved, That District Assembly, No. 41 Knights of Labor, of Maryland, declares itself in the strongest terms in favor of a reduction in the price of gas in Baltimore city; and it further declares that in its opinion, all municipalities using gas should own the plant, and especially Baltimore, as it is inferred an ample plant can be constructed for \$4,000, or less.
