Senate bill entitled an Act to change the name of the Brooklyn and Curtis Bay Light and Water Company of Anne Arundel county, and to amend, define and enlarge the powers of said company.

Senate bill entitled an Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Anne Arundel county to borrow money on the credit of the county for the purpose of repairing and remodeling the Court House, to issue bonds for the payment of the same.

Senate bill entitled an Act to authorize and empower the County Commissioners of Talbot county to issue bonds to the amount of \$25,000, bearing interest at a rate not exceeding five per centum for the purpose of raising a sum of money sufficient to pay the county's subscription of \$25,000 to the capital
