House bill entitled an Act to provide for the destruction of fruit trees in the State of Maryland infected with the disease known as the yellows.

Wherever the words "County Commissioners" appear in this bill, strike out the same, and insert in lieu thereof the words "Judges of the Orphans' Court."

Add an additional section to follow section 8, and to be designated "section 9."

Section 9. Be it enacted, That this Act shall go into effect June 1st, 1898.
