Mr. Coffin submitted the following message:

The Clerk of the House of Delegates appeared and delivered the following bills:

House bill entitled an Act to carry into effect section 1, of Article 7, of the Constitution of this State, so far as the same relates to Baltimore county, and to repeal section 31, of Article 3, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Baltimore County," sub-title "County Commissioners."

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Hubner, Brown and Bennett.

House bill entitled an Act to authorize and empower and direct the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to appropriate a sum of money to pay for the use of a suitable building to be occupied by the members of the Veteran Volunteer Firemens Association of Baltimore city.

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Baltimore City Senators.

House bill entitled an Act to protect associations and unions of workingmen and persons in their labels, trade-marks and form of advertising, and to punish offenders for violation of the same.

Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Agriculture and Labor.
