may be necessary to plainly designate said lines, and to levy upon the assessable property of Somerset county such sum or sums, not exceeding one hundred and fifty dollars, as may be necessary for this purpose.

Senate bill entitled an Act prescribing the regulations and conditions upon which the Board of Public Works shall sell the State's interest in all works of internal improvements, whether as a stockholder or a credit, and also the State's interest in any banking corporation as authorized by section 3 of Article 12, of the Constitution, as proposed to be amended by the Act of 1890, chapter 362, and adopted by the people at the general election on November 3d, 1891, and to appropriate a sum of money for carrying this Act into effect.

Senate bill entitled an Act to appropriate a sum of money for the assistance of the Peninsular Horticultural Society, for each of the two years ending, respectively, on the 30th day of September, 1893 and 1894.

Senate bill entitled an Act to fix the limit and define the office of the County Commissioners of Queen Anne's county elected on Tuesday next after the first Monday in November, 1891, in pursuance of section 1, of Article 7, of the Constitution of the State and of such Commissioners as shall be elected or appointed hereafter.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES.
