

House bill entitled an Act to repeal section 230, of Article 97, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Obstructing railroads," sub-title "Railroads Obstructing."

Senate bill entitled an Act to regulate the practice of medicine and surgery in Maryland for non-resident practitioners.

Which were adopted.

And reported favorably, the following bills:

House bill entitled an Act to prevent deception and fraud by owners or agents who may have control of any stallion kept for service by proclaiming or publishing fraudulent or false pedigrees or records, and to protect such owners or agents, and the collection of fees for service of such stallions.

House bill entitled an Act to repeal the Act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January Session, 1890, entitled an Act to amend Article 52, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Justice of the Peace, except as to the city of Baltimore," by adding a new section to be designated "Section 11 A."

House bill entitled an Act to enable the Martini German Evangelical Lutheran Congregation, Unaltered Augsburg Confession, of Baltimore, Maryland, to sell, lease, dispose of or mortgage and convey its property.

House bill entitled an Act to sanction and make valid a bequest of Nancy Camel, late of Washington county, deceased, to Manor Church of the Tunker denomination, and a bequest from said Nancy Camel to the Methodist Episcopal Church, situated in the town of Sharpsburg, Washington county, Maryland.

Which were read the second time.

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal section 21, of Article 17, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Clerks of Courts," and to re-enact the same.

Which was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal chapter 17, of the Acts of the General Assembly passed at the January Session, 1892.
