With the following proposed amendments:

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Strike out all after the words "a bill," and insert the following:

"Entitled an Act to repeal chapter 17, of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January Session, 1892, entitled an Act to add two additional sections to Article 27, of the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Crimes and Punishments,' subtitle 'Railroad Obstructing,' to follow section 231, and to be known as 'Sections 231 A and 231 B.'

"Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, that Article 17, of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January Session, 1892, entitled an Act to add two additional sections to Article 27 of the Code of Public General Laws, title 'Crimes and Punishments,' sub-title 'Railroad Obstructions,' to be known as 'Sections 231 A and 231 B,' be and the same are hereby repealed.

"Sec. 2. And be it enacted that this Act shall take

effect from the date of its passage."

Which was adopted.

Said bill, as amended, was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
