the captain is a resident. This provision not to apply to Baltimore city; also, that persons engaged on said vessels shall not be required to pay any shipping fees.

Amend section 68 by inserting the following after the words "City of Baltimore," in line 17, "and one for St. Mary's county."

Which were adopted.

Said bill, as amended, was read the second time, ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Wootton, from the Committee on Agriculture and Labor, reported favorably,

AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

Strike out all after the word "government," in line 3, of Article 15, and insert: "All taxes ought to be uniform upon the same kinds of property or class of subjects, and should be levied and collected under general laws, but the General Assembly may, by general laws, exempt from taxation all public property used for public purposes, all churches or buildings used exclusively for public worship and the furniture contained therein, and the parsonages connected therewith, burying-grounds not used for private or corporate profit, all purely charitable or benevolent institutions, literary or educational institutions, with the furniture and equipments contained in such char-
