INTRODUCTION OF BILLS.

By Mr. Gorter, the following bills:

Senate bill entitled an Act to add five new sections to Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Liquor and Intoxicating Drinks," to follow section 653 V, and to be designated as "Sections 653 W, 653 X, 653 Y, 653 Z and 653 AA."
