

39 C. The said Treasurer shall occupy the office of County Commissioners and keep the office open for business from ten o'clock A. M., until twelve M., on not less than three days in each and every week, except Sundays and legal holidays, unless a leave of absence be granted by the Board of County Commissioners, and said Treasurer shall hold himself ready at all other times to transact the business of his office necessary to the public interest and convenience.

Which were adopted.

Said bill, as amended, was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

House bill entitled an Act to incorporate the town of Lonaconing, in Allegany county.

Senate bill entitled an Act to fix, limit and define the office of the County Commissioners of Queen Anne's county, elected on Tuesday next after the first Monday in November, 1891, in pursuance of section 1, of Article 7, of the Constitution of the State, and of such commissioners as shall be elected or appointed hereafter.

Which was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

House bill entitled an Act to add certain sections to Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Police," to come in after section 756, and to be designated as section 756 A, 756 B and 756 C.

House bill entitled an Act to add a new section to Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Mayor and City Council of Baltimore," relating to the hours of labor of mechanics and laborers employed upon city work.
