BY THE SENATE,
March 15th, 1892.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

The Senate has received your message of the 14th inst., requesting the Senate to recede from a certain amendment to the House bill entitled an Act to repeal section 367, of Article 4, of the Public Local Laws, title "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Harbor, Docks and Wharfs," and to re-enact with amendments. The Senate respectfully declines to recede from said amendment, and requests the appointment of a Conference Committee on the part of the House of Delegates and Senate to consider the matter of said amendment. The Senate herewith returns said bill and amendment.
