It appearing that the Hon. Charles H. Gibson had received a majority of all the votes cast (a majority of all the members elected to both Houses being present and voting,) the Chairman declared that the Hon. Charles H. Gibson having received a majority of all the votes cast he is therefore elected Senator from the State of Maryland to the Congress of the United States to fill the unexpired term of the Hon. Ephraim K. Wilson, deceased, which term expires on the 4th day of March, 1897.
