Fig-gins, late of Frederick county, Maryland, deceased, said will being of record in the office of the Register of Wills of Frederick county, aforesaid, of the sum of five hundred dollars to Jefferson Congregation Reformed Church, at Jefferson, Frederick county, aforesaid; and also to a bequest under said will of one hundred dollars to the Reformed Church Consistory of Jefferson, Frederick county, aforesaid; to be applied toward keeping in proper order the fence and burial lot.

“Thirty-ninth. To a deed from Jacob Smith and Annie Smith, his wife, dated March 30th, 1897, and recorded in Liber J. T. J., No. 16, folio 203, of the Land Records of Frederick county, Maryland, of a certain lot of ground in Emmittsburg, in said county, described in said deed to the Trustees of The Emmittsburg Methodist Episcopal Church in Frederick county, Maryland, in trust, for the use of the Ministry of the M. E. Church in the United States, in conformity to the discipline, usage and ministerial appointment of said church, and if sold, the proceeds to be invested in conformity to said discipline.

“Fortieth. To the following bequest, under the last will and testament of Rebecca F. Wilmer, late of Charles county deceased, on record in the office of the Register of Wills of said county.

(a) A bequest of two hundred dollars to the Vestry of Port Tobacco Protestant Episcopal Parish in Charles county. (b) A bequest of one hundred dollars to the Bishop of the Protestant Episcopal Diocese of Washington, D. C. for foreign and domestic missions.

“Forty-first. To a bequest under the last will and testament of Benjamin D. Tubman, late of Charles county deceased, of five hundred dollars to the Vestry of St. John's Parish in Prince George's and Charles counties.

“Forty second. To grant and conveyance of eighteen perches of land in Charles county made by Samuel W. Lloyd and wife to the Vestry of St. Johns Parish in Prince George's and Charles counties.
