HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION No. 12.

Whereas, It is represented that Fort Frederick, situated in Washington county, Maryland, is being pillaged and is rapidly reaching a state of dilapidation and ruin; and

Whereas, It is eminently proper that this fortification rich in historic lore and the only one of those of the ante-Revolutionary period left, connecting the past with the present, should be rescued and preserved; therefore, be it

Resolved, by the General Assembly of Maryland, that His Excellency, Governor Edwin Warfield, Mr. Thomas Leiber Patterson of Cumberland, Maryland, Mr. Alexander Armstrong, Jr., and Miss Leonore Hamilton, of Hagerstown, Maryland, be and they are hereby appointed a committee to prepare an accurate
