Thomas Cresap in 1739, and Peter Johnson in 1743, to the present time, including survey and plat of the property, all of which proceedings and data the said committee is requested to submit to the next General Assembly of Maryland, and the sum of fifty dollars is hereby appropriated to defray the expenses of said commission.
