● REPORTS OF SELECT COMMITTEES.

Mr. Perkins, from Select Committee, reported unfavorably,

House bill, File No. 491, entitled "An Act to authorize the appointment of the Harbor Master and Assistant Inspector of weights and measures and assistant to the Market Master and assistant of the city of Baltimore."

Which unfavorable report was adopted.

Also reported without recommendation,

House bill, File No. 670, entitled "An Act to authorize the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to issue its certificate of stock to an amount not exceeding six million dollars for the purpose of providing the money to pay costs and expenses of condemning, opening, grading, paving and curbing the streets, avenues, lanes and alleys of the annex portion of Baltimore city and to authorize the appointment of a commission to be known as the 'Annex Improvement Commission,' and to define the duties of said commission."

House bill, File No. 260, entitled "An Act to authorize and empower the Board of Police Commissioners of Baltimore city to pay Wm. W. Brown, a former policeman, the sum of \$9 per week."
