

certify to the Mayor and City Council that any land, buildings, stone, material or other property belonging to any person or corporation, or the removal thereof shall be necessary or convenient for the construction of a proposed sewer, then the said Mayor and City Council shall proceed forthwith to acquire said land or other property without further report or certification to them in the manner provided in section 175 B of the City Charter, as enacted by chapter 127 of the Acts of 1902, of the General Assembly of Maryland, and the expense of any purchase or condemnation for sewer purposes shall be paid out of the said sewer fund.

"Sec. 6. Be it further enacted, That this Act shall not take effect until it shall have been submitted to a vote of the duly registered voters of Havre de Grace, and shall have been approved by a majority of votes cast at an election to be held on Monday, the second day of May, in the year nineteen hundred and four, and to be conducted in the mode prescribed by the existing charter of Havre de Grace, and if a majority of the said votes shall be cast in the affirmative, then the Mayor and City Council of Havre de Grace shall issue said bonds and proceed with the public improvement mentioned and provided for in this Act, but if a majority of said votes shall be cast in the negative then this Act shall be of no effect.

"Sec. 7. Be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage."

Which amendments were adopted.

The bill read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Betts, from Select Committee, reported favorably,
