Senate bill, File No. 59, entitled "An Act to repeal and re-enact sections 33, 211, 212, 213, 214, 215 and 216, of Article 1 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title 'Allegheny County,' sub-title 'County Commissioners and Roads,' and to re-enact the same with amendments, and add certain additional section to said Article 1, sub-title 'Roads,' and to provide for a road directory and a road engineer in Allegheny county, and to place all the public roads in said Allegheny county, under the control of the road directory, to be created by this Act."

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Amend by adding after section 216 T, and at the end thereof, as follows:

"Provided, that one month before the day of the general election in this State, for the year of 1905, twenty per cent. of the registered voters of Allegheny county sign a petition requesting a referendum to the vote of the people of the said county upon this Act, then the Election Supervisors for Allegheny county shall cause to be placed on the official ballot of said election the usual square for and against said Act, and it shall read "for the road law," with a square opposite in which the voter may make his mark, and the other to read "against the road law," with a square opposite in which the voter may make his mark; and if a majority of the votes cast thereon shall be in favor of the road law, then the same shall continue in full force and effect; but if the majority of the votes cast, shall be against said road law, then the said road law shall
