the Legislatures of Maryland and Virginia, on concurrent Legislation for the Potomac river and for drafting the bill embodying the agreement reached, and that ten dollars be paid to Hugh R. Riley for transmitting copies of the said bill upon its passage to the members of the said committee from Virginia.

Which was read and referred to the Committee on Finance.

Honorable Spencer C. Jones,

President of the Senate of Maryland:

Sir: In obedience to the order of the Senate passed on Thursday, March 24th, 1904, on Saturday, April the second, 1904, at the hour of 10.14, a. m., I, in person, delivered to Thomas Parran, Clerk of the Court of Appeals, the two Senate documents proposing amendments to the Constitution of this State.

The first one entitled,

"An Act to amend section 1 of Article 1 of the Constitution of this State, and to provide for the submission of said amendment to the qualified voters of this State for adoption or rejection," which said document was indersed as follows:

"This is to certify that this engrossed document proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the State of Maryland, the original of which was passed by the Senate by yeas and nays, more than three-fifths of all the members elected voting in the affirmative, on March 3, 1904."
