AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

In lieu of original bill and all amendments.

Strike out all after the words "A Bill," and insert the following in lieu thereof:

"Entitled 'An Act to establish and promote the industry of oyster culture in the State of Maryland.

"Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That any bona fide resident of Maryland shall have the right to plant and cultivate oysters in the waters of this State, and such right shall be exercised in the manner prescribed in the following sections of this Act, and shall be subject to the regulations, provisions and limitations hereinafter set forth
