tions so to be added to such Article to be designated as 'Sections 69, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, 79, 80, 81 and 82,' and to come in after 'Section 68.' '

Endorsed: "Read the third time and passed by yeas and nays."

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.
