Senate bill, File No. 332, entitled "An Act to repeal section 63 and to repeal and re-enact sections 44, 48, 49, 51, 52, 53, 55, 57, 58, 60, 62 and 69 and to amend by adding an additional sub-section to each sections 59, 71 and 75 all of the aforesaid sections being sections of Article 10 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title 'Dorchester County,' sub-title 'Cambridge,' as enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, at its January session, 1900."

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Section 69, line 3, strike out "fifty" and insert "forty-five."

Strike out "59" (27) and insert the following:

Sec. 59. (27.) To regulate the use of the streets, lanes and alleys of Cambridge, by telephone, telegraph, electric light and other wires and poles, in over and upon the same, provided, that nothing in this section shall be so construed as to give the Commissioners of Cambridge the power and authority to impose and license fees upon such wires and poles, or the use of said streets and alleys.
