to expressly authorize it to condemn certain parcels of land of the Chesapeake and Chio Canal Company lying on the northern and southern sides of said canal, together with the easement of crossing the same with its bridges and railroad, and the easement of the right during construction, to erect and use temporary platforms, bridges and appliances in, upon, or over said canal to provide for transporting waste material from the north side to the south side thereof and to give said Railroad Company other powers proper to accomplish said objects and purposes.
