Chapter 81.

An Act to repeal Article 16, of the Code of Public Local Laws title "Montgomery County," sub-title "Liquors and intoxicating drinks," section 133 and section 134 as amended by the Act of 1894, chapter 528, and re-enact the following in lieu thereof.

Chapter 82.

An Act to repeal sections 139 and 152 of Article 10 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Dorchester County," sub-title "East New Market," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Chapter 83.

An Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments, section 44 D, of Article 14 of volume 2 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, titled "County Commissioners and County Collectors."

Chapter 84.

An Act to add one new section to Article 56 of the Code of Public General Laws of the State of Maryland, said section to be known as section 83 A, for the purpose of prohibiting the issuance of licenses for the sale of liquors or intoxicating beverages of whatsoever kind on the Potomac River or upon the property of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company within the State of Maryland.
