#### Chapter 131.

An Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Howard County to pay claims of James F. Melvin, L. A. Rettaliata and N. W. Burton for printing and publishing notices of election.

#### Chapter 132.

An Act to authorize and require the County Commissioners of Baltimore County to levy a sum to be applied to the building of a school house in the 5th district of Baltimore County, at Arcadia.

#### Chapter 133.

An Act to create and establish a new election district in Wicomico County to be known as the 13th, or Camden Election district of Wicomico County.

#### Chapter 134.

An Act to repeal section 98 of Article 5 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Calvert County," sub-title "Liquor and Intoxicating Drinks," and re-enact the same so as to read as follows.

#### Chapter 136.

An Act to add an additional section to Article 18 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Wicomico County," to be known as section 208 A, under a new sub-title of "Fraud on Livery Stable Keepers," providing for the punishment of persons hiring horses or vehicles from livery stable keepers in Wicomico County to go a certain distance and using said horses or vehicles for a greater distance.
