Louis E. McComas, a Senator in the Congress of the United States from this State, whose term of office will expire March 4, A. D. 1905.

After which,

The Chief Clerk of the House of Delegates read the proceedings of the House of Delegates on the preceding day, in relation to the balloting for a Senator in Congress of the United States from this State, showing the fact that no person, at the vote so taken had received a majority of all the votes of the Members of the House of Delegates of the State of Maryland, for Senator in the Congress of the United States for six years in succession to the Hon. Louis E. McComas, a Senator in the Congress of the United States from this State, whose term of office will expire March 4, A. D. 1905.
