

Mr. Wilson from the Committee on Judicial Proceedings reported favorably,

Senate bill entitled "An Act to declare the sanction and consent of the General Assembly of Maryland to the bequest contained in the fifth codicil to the last will and testament of Olive Warfield, late of Baltimore city, deceased, of five thousand dollars to Trinity Methodist Church South of Baltimore city."

Which report was adopted, and the bill was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

We have received your message proposing that all bills and leaves to introduce bills, to sanction bequests, devises, sales, gifts or conveyance to religious or charitable objects, be referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings and the Committee on the Judiciary of the House, and that said committees be instructed to report on March 11, 1904, a general bill embracing all such bills and leaves except where there is a special reason for more speedy action, in which case separate bills may be introduced, and we respectfully concur therein.
