By Mr. Biddison,

A bill entitled "An Act to authorize and direct the County Commissioners of Baltimore county, to pay to Eugene Burke, Deputy Sheriff, a sum sufficient to reimburse him for expenses incurred in his defence in a suit brought against him as deputy sheriff of said county, for false imprisonment, by one George W. Edgar."
