

Senate bill, File No. 15, entitled "An Act to appropriate the sum of \$60,000 for the use of the Commissioners of the State of Maryland, at the St. Louis, Louisiana Purchase Exposition."

AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

1. In the first line, strike out the word "sixty," and insert in lieu thereof, "forty."

2. At the end of the first line of section 1, of said bill, strike out the word "sixty," and insert in lieu thereof, "forty."

3. On the ninth line of section 1, of engrossed bill, strike out all of said section after word "applied."

Which said amendments were severally adopted.
