

of said public roads, may bring their actions against said County Commissioners, and prosecute the same to final decision the same as if this Act had not been passed. The Attorney for the County Commissioners shall be the Attorney of the Road Directors, without additional compensation, and the County Commissioners shall provide said directors a room in the Court-house, and the clerk of the Commissioners shall act as clerk of the Road Directors without additional compensation.

"216 T. Every person who shall use on the roads of Allegany county, in hauling loads of six thousand pounds weight and upwards, any wagon or wagons having tires less than four inchss in width, shall be liable to a fine of five dollars for each and every offense, upon conviction before a Justice of the Peace, which fine shall be held by the Treasurer for the said Road Directors. It shall be the duty of the County Commissioners to turn over all the property, tools, machinery, material, supplies and other apparatus appropriate to the roads and bridges, to said Road Directors, and to place all maps, evidences of title and other records of the county appertaining to roads at the free and full disposal of said directors. The said Road Directors shall cause to be published once every year, a full, detailed and itemized statement giving the names, amounts and purpose of every expenditure made by them, which said statement shall be printed on a single sheet of paper, and said directors may contract for the publishing of said statement to be published one time in one or more newspapers in said county, and be printed by the lowest sealed bidder therefor; a copy of which statement shall be enclosed by the treasurer with the levy list and tax bill to every tax-payer. The Road Directors and Road Engineer shall begin the administration of their offices on the first Monday in April, 1904, and the Road Directors shall have power to make rules and regulations to carry out the purposes of this Act.

"Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage."

Which amendment was adopted; bill read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
